Revealing the awrah during prayer



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بسُمِ ٱللهِ ٱلرَّحْمَ ﴿ ٱلرَّحِيمِ

In the name of Allaah, the Most Merciful, the Bestower of Mercy

Questioner: Sometimes whilst praying – especially during rukoo' (bowing) and Sajood (prostration) – part of the awrah (private parts) of a person becomes exposed due to his wearing trousers. So what is the ruling concerning the wearing of trousers whilst praying?¹

Shaykh Abdul-Azeez ibn Baaz (رَحِبَهُ اللهُ)² If the man's trousers cover what is between his navel and his knees and are loose fitting, wide and baggy, then it fulfils the condition for the correctness of the Prayer. However, what is more preferable is to wear a qamees (long shirt) – which reaches half-way down to the shins, or just above the anklebone – over the trousers. This is a more complete form of covering the awrah. Likewise, Prayer in an izaar (a loose lower garment) is more preferable than Prayer in a pair of trousers without a long shirt – since the izaar far better covers the awrah than a pair of trousers.
